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

### Part II. INFORMATION ABOUT THE SCHEME

### A. HOW WILL THE SCHEME ALLOCATE ITS ASSETS?

Under normal circumstances, the asset allocation of the Scheme will be as follows:

The Scheme will invest in physical gold of the prescribed quality and standard.

A small portion of the net assets will be invested in Debt and money market instruments as permitted by SEBI / RBI including call money market or Tri-party Repo on Government securities or treasury bills or repo or in an alternative investment as may be provided by RBI, to meet the liquidity requirements of the scheme. From time to time, the Scheme may also hold cash.

The cumulative gross exposure through physical gold, Debt & Money market instruments (including Cash and Cash Equivalent) and such other securities/assets as may be permitted by the Board from time to time subject to regulatory approvals, if any should not exceed 100% of the net assets of the scheme.

Cash or cash equivalents with residual maturity of less than 91 days may be treated as not creating any exposure. SEBI vide letter dated November 3, 2021 has clarified that Cash Equivalent shall consist of Government Securities, T-Bills and Repo on Government Securities.

#### **Portfolio Rebalancing**

#### Rebalancing due to short term defensive consideration:

The Scheme shall primarily invest in Physical Gold and invest a small portion of its net assets in debt and money market securities, to meet the liquidity requirements (for honouring expenses / repurchase / redemptions / etc). In view of the nature of the Scheme, the asset allocation pattern as indicated above may not change, except in line with the changes made in SEBI (MF) Regulations, from time to time.

Subject to the SEBI (MF) Regulations, the asset allocation pattern indicated above may change from time to time, keeping in view market conditions, and political and economic factors. Such changes in the investment pattern will be for short term and defensive considerations as per para 1.14.1.2 of SEBI Master Circular on Mutual Funds. However, due to market conditions, the AMC may invest beyond the range set out above. Such deviations shall



normally be for a short-term purpose only not exceeding 7 days, for defensive considerations and the intention being at all times to protect the interests of the Unit Holders.

Provided further and subject to the above, any change in the asset allocation affecting the investment profile of the Scheme shall be effected only in accordance with the provisions of sub regulation (15A) of Regulation 18 and Regulation 25(26) of the SEBI (MF) Regulations.

### **B. WHERE WILL THE SCHEME INVEST?**

Subject to the SEBI (MF) Regulations, the corpus of the Scheme can be invested in any (but not exclusively) of the following securities:

- 1. The significant portion of corpus of the Scheme will be invested in physical gold of 99.5% finesses i.e. 995 parts per 1000 parts or higher.
- 2. Securities created and issued by Governments of India and/or repos/reverse repos in such Government Securities as may be permitted by RBI (including but not limited to coupon bearing bonds, zero coupon bonds and treasury bills).
- 3. Securities guaranteed by the Central and State Governments (including but not limited to coupon bearing bonds, zero coupon bonds and treasury bills).
- 4. Debt obligations of domestic Government agencies and statutory bodies, which may or may not carry a Central/State Government guarantee.
- 5. Corporate debt and securities (of both public and private sector undertakings) including Bonds, Debentures, Notes, Strips etc.
- 6. Money Market Instruments include Commercial papers, commercial bills, treasury bills, Government securities having an unexpired maturity upto one year, call or notice money, certificate of deposit, usance bill and any other like instruments as specified by the Reserve Bank of India from time to time subject to regulatory approvals, if any.
- 7. Certificate of Deposits (CDs).
- 8. Commercial Paper (CPs).
- 9. The non-convertible part of convertible securities.
- 10. Any other domestic fixed income securities.
- 11. Any other like instruments as may be permitted by RBI/SEBI/ such other Regulatory Authority from time to time.

The securities mentioned above could be listed or to be listed, secured or unsecured, rated or un-rated and of varying maturity, as enabled under SEBI Regulations/ circulars/ RBI. The securities may be acquired through Initial Public Offerings (IPOs), secondary market operations, private placement or negotiated deals.

The Scheme may also enter into repurchase and reverses repurchase obligations in all securities held by it as per the guidelines and regulations applicable to such transactions.

### C. WHAT ARE THE INVESTMENT STRATEGIES?

Aditya Birla Sun Life Gold ETF is a passively managed fund tracking the price of Gold and reflects the performance of the Gold price. The Fund would invest in physical gold of prescribed quantity and quality (fineness) and endeavor to track the spot price of gold. The scheme invests in gold regardless of investment merit. The Fund would invest upto 100% in physical Gold and/or upto 5% in debt and money market instruments to meet the liquidity requirements, subject to tracking error. The scheme may buy or sell gold at different points of time during the trading session at the then prevailing prices which may or may not correspond to its closing price, due to disinvestments to meet redemptions, transactions cost and recurring expenses, execution of large buy/sell orders etc.

The Fund Manager would monitor the tracking error of the Scheme on an ongoing basis and would seek to minimize tracking error to the maximum extent possible. Under normal circumstances, such tracking errors are not expected to exceed 2% per annum subject to compliance with para 3.6.3.1 of SEBI Master Circular on Mutual Funds.



However, this may vary due to the volatility in the markets and any other reasons beyond the control of the Fund Manager. There can be no assurance or guarantee that the Scheme will achieve any particular level of tracking error relative to performance of the benchmark Index.

Effect of Movements in the price of gold on the NAV of Aditya Birla Sun Life Gold ETF: As movements in the price of gold are expected to directly affect the NAV of the scheme investors should understand the impact of fluctuations in the price of gold on the NAV of the scheme. Investors, however, should also be aware that past movements in the gold price are not indicators of future movements.

### **Risk Control**

The Mutual Fund has built adequate internal risk management controls and safeguards including on-going oversight to ensure that the Scheme, which is passively managed, is in line with the defined investment objectives as per the SID and in compliance with SEBI (MF) Regulations.

The Mutual Fund will strive to achieve the investment objective by way of a judicious portfolio mix comprising of Gold bullion, Debt Securities and Money Market Instruments. Investments in gold bullion would be primarily assessed with regard to its fineness. Every investment opportunity in Debt Securities and Money Market Instruments would be assessed with regard to credit risk, interest rate risk and liquidity risk.

While these measures are expected to mitigate the above risks to a large extent, there can be no assurance that these risks would be completely eliminated.

### TRACKING ERROR

"Tracking Error" i.e. the annualised standard deviation of the difference in daily returns between physical gold and the NAV of gold ETF based on past one year rolling over data (For ETFs in existence for a period of less than one year, annualized standard deviation shall be calculated based on available data) shall not exceed 2%. The disclosure regarding the same shall be made on monthly basis on the website of the AMC. Tracking Error may arise including but not limited to the following reasons: -

- a) Any delay experienced in the purchase or sale of Gold due to:
  - Illiquidity of gold,
  - Delay in realization of sale proceeds,
  - Creating a lot size to buy the required amount of gold.
- b) The charging of expenses to the scheme including investment management fees, custodian fees, taxes, levies, etc.
- c) The potential for trades to fail, which may result in the Scheme not having acquired gold at a price necessary to track the index.
- d) The holding of a cash position prior to distribution and accrued expenses.
- e) Execution of large buy/sell orders
- f) The Scheme may buy or sell gold at different points of time during the trading session at the then prevailing prices which may not correspond to its closing prices.
- g) Disinvestments to meet redemptions, recurring expenses, etc.

It will be the endeavor of the fund manager to keep the tracking error as low as possible.

In case of unavoidable circumstances in the nature of force majeure which are beyond the control of the AMCs, the tracking error may exceed 2%, for which approval of Board of AMC and Trustees shall be taken and the same shall prominently be disclosed on the website of the AMC.

Along with the disclosure of tracking error, gold ETF schemes shall also disclose the tracking difference i.e. the difference of returns between physical gold and the gold ETF, on the website of the AMC on monthly basis for tenures 1 year, 3 year, 5 year, 10 year and since the date of allotment of units.



### Portfolio Turnover

Portfolio Turnover measures the volume of trading that occurs in a Scheme's portfolio (gold in this scheme) during a given time period. The Scheme is an open-ended Exchange Traded Fund. It is therefore expected that there would be a number of subscriptions and redemptions on a daily basis through Stock Exchange(s) or with Aditya Birla Sun Life Mutual Fund directly by Market Makers and Large Investors that may require purchase or sale of gold. In view of the nature of the Scheme, it is difficult to estimate with any reasonable measure of accuracy, the likely turnover in the portfolio. Portfolio Turnover is defined as the aggregate of purchases and sales as a percentage of the corpus during the specified period of time.

### D. HOW WILL THE SCHEME BENCHMARK ITS PERFORMANCE?

The performance of the Scheme will be benchmarked to the performance of **Domestic price of physical gold**.

### Rationale for adoption of benchmark:

Since there is no suitable index catering to gold or instruments linked to gold, the performance of the scheme will be benchmarked against the **Domestic price of physical gold**. The performance of this scheme will be compared with Gold ETFs in the Industry. The performance will be placed before the Investment Committee as well as the Board of Directors of the AMC and the Trustee Company in each of their meetings.





#### **ISSUE OF UNITS DURING ONGOING OFFER**

- (a) As the Units of the scheme have been listed on National Stock Exchange of India Limited (NSE) and BSE Limited (BSE), investors may buy or sell units of scheme on all trading days in round lot of 1 (one) unit at prevailing listed price on such Stock Exchange(s).
- (b) The fractional units allotted to investors shall not be available for trading on stock exchanges.
- (c) Each Unit of Aditya Birla Sun Life Gold ETF will be approximately equal to 0.01 gram of Gold.

(d) Alternatively, Market Makers and Large Investors can directly buy / sell units from the Fund in creation unit size.

# FOR SUBSCRIPTION / REDEMPTION OF UNITS DIRECTLY WITH MUTUAL FUND USING PORTFOLIO DEPOSIT AND CASH COMPONENT:

**Portfolio Deposit:** will be in predefined quantity (i.e. weighing 1 Kg) & in multiples of 1 Kg & purity (fineness) of 995 parts per 1000 (99.5%) of physical gold. The quantity & purity (fineness) of physical gold will be defined & announced by the AMC from time to time.

**Cash Component:** represents the difference between the applicable net asset value (NAV) of a creation unit size and the market value of the Portfolio Deposit

### I) For Subscription of units in Creation Unit size with Portfolio

### Deposit and Cash Component:

- 1) Market Maker/Large Investor may submit an application for purchase of units in Creation Unit Size to the AMC on any Business Day, within the applicable cut- off timing for NAV applicability. Large investors can subscribe/redeem directly with the AMC for an amount greater than INR 25 crores.
- 2) By submitting the application the Market Maker/Large Investor agree to transfer (deposit) the Portfolio Deposit (i.e. physical gold) and / or the cash component in the scheme's account. The physical deposit of gold & Cash Component is explained below. The day on which the application is submitted is referred to as day 'T'.
- 3) Market Maker/Large Investor are required to transfer (deposit) the Portfolio Deposit (i.e. physical gold) to the Custodian latest by T+1 day basis, while the balance Cash Component, if any has to be paid to the AMC only by means of payment instruction of Real Time Gross Settlement (RTGS) or National Electronic Funds Transfer (NEFT) or any other (electronic) mode as may be decided by AMC from time to time.
- 4) As per the agreement with Custodian for physical gold, Custodian will accept physical gold only if it is in compliance with the good delivery as per regulatory norms.
- 5) On having credited the scheme's account with gold deposits in the physical form, Custodian will confirm to the AMC of vaulting of gold and in turn AMC will instruct the Registrar & Transfer Agent, the total number of units to be created & upon realization of Cash Component, the creation of units will be at the NAV of the scheme on day 'T' (i.e. the day on which the application was made by AP/LI within the applicable cut-off timing.)
- 6) The Registrar & Transfer Agent will then allocate the units to the demat account of the Market Maker/Large Investor.

### **II)** For Redemption of units in Creation Unit size with Portfolio

#### **Deposit and Cash Component:**

- 1) The procedure by which an Market Maker/Large Investor can redeem units of the scheme in Creation unit size will mirror the procedure for the subscription of units in creation unit size as above.
- Market Maker/Large Investor may make a redemption request to the AMC for redemption of units in Creation Unit size on any business day in a duly filled redemption form, within the applicable cut-off timing for NAV applicability.
- 3) The request for redemption by Market Maker/Large Investor needs to be enclosed with the delivery order used in the depository system duly acknowledged by the DP with whom the Market Maker/Large Investor has a depository account stating the number of units transferred to the scheme's DP account on T+0 business days.
- 4) The redemption price for redemption of units in Creation Unit Size will be based on the applicable NAV and transaction charges, if any on the date of redemption request, subject to cut-off timing limits.
- 5) The delivery of physical gold to Market Maker/Large Investor will be made at the location of the Custodian within the jurisdiction of Mumbai. The expenses associated with taking physical delivery of gold will have to be borne by the Market Maker/Large Investor.
- 6) Cash Component, if any, of the Redemption proceeds will be despatched to Market Maker/Large Investor within 10 Business days of the date of redemption, subject to confirmation with the depository records of the Scheme's DP account.

# The Portfolio Deposit and Cash Component may change from time to time due to change in NAV and will be decided and announced by AMC.

### FOR SUBSCRIPTION / REDEMPTION OF UNITS DIRECTLY WITH MUTUAL FUND USING CASH ONLY:



### I) For Subscription of units in Creation Unit size for Cash:

- AMC shall allow cash purchases of units in Creation Unit Size by AP/LI. They shall make creation request to the AMC where upon the AMC will arrange to purchase the underlying physical gold.
- Market Maker/Large Investor may submit an application for the purchase of units in Creation unit size to the AMC on any business day, within the applicable cut-off timing for the NAV applicability, by payment of requisite cash as determined by AMC by means of payment instruction of Real Time Gross Settlement (RTGS) or National Electronic Funds Transfer (NEFT) or any other (electronic) mode as may be decided by AMC from time to time. Large investors can subscribe/redeem directly with the AMC for an amount greater than INR 25 crores
- On receipt of confirmation from the Custodian of crediting the Scheme's account with the gold deposits purchased by the AMC on behalf of Market Maker/Large Investor, AMC will instruct the Registrar & Transfer Agent the total number of units to be created & upon realization of the requisite cash, the creation of units will be at the iNAV of the scheme on T day (i.e. the day on which application was made by Market Maker/Large Investor within the applicable cut-off timing).

#### **II)** For Redemption of units in Creation Unit size for Cash:

- Also, AMC provides for cash redemption of units in Creation Unit Size by Market Maker/Large Investor. On receipt of such redemption requests, AMC will arrange to sell physical gold on behalf of the Market Maker/Large Investor. Accordingly, the sale proceeds of physical gold after adjusting necessary charges / costs & exit load, if any will be remitted to the AP/LI.
- The redemption price for redemption of units in Creation Unit Size will be based on the applicable iNAV and transaction costs, if any on the date of redemption request, subject to cut-off timing limits.
- Redemption proceeds will be dispatched to Market Maker/Large Investor within 10 Business days of the date
  of redemption, subject to confirmation with the depository records of the Scheme's DP account.

The minimum number of units that can be created / redeemed for Cash directly with the Fund will be announced by the Fund from time to time.

The role of AMC is of a facilitator to the Market Makers/Large Investors to purchase /sell Gold on their behalf for the purpose of creating /redeeming units of the scheme in Creation Unit Size.

The Fund may from time to time change the size of the Creation Unit size in order to equate it with marketable lots of underlying instruments.

The scheme shall meet its expenses out of the cash held & in case, the cash is insufficient to meet the expenses, the scheme may be required to sell the Portfolio Deposit to meet the Scheme expenses resulting into Portfolio Deposit being lower than the units allotted under the scheme.

#### **REDEMPTION / REPURCHASE OF FRACTIONAL UNITS OF THE SCHEME:**

- The AMC provides an option to the investors to redeem fractional units allotted during the NFO, on an ongoing basis. Thus, such Fractional units may be redeemed by unitholders on any business day during the ongoing offer period commencing not later than 5 (five) business days from the date of allotment at a price equivalent to applicable NAV. The AMC only provides for repurchase/redemption of fractional units on ongoing basis i.e. only the Fractional Units allotted during NFO may be sold to AMC/Mutual Fund and they shall not be available for trading on stock exchanges.
- 2. The request for redemption of fractional units needs to be enclosed with the delivery order used in the depository system duly acknowledged by the DP with whom the Investor has a depository account stating the fractional unit (upto 3 decimals as depicted in transaction statements issued by DP) transferred to the scheme's DP account.
- 3. The redemption price for redemption of fractional Units will be based on the applicable NAV on the date of redemption request subject to cut-off timing limits.
- 4. Redemption proceeds shall be dispatched to the unitholders within 10 working days from the date of redemption, subject to confirmation with the depository records of the Scheme's DP account.
- 5. In case a redemption application is made for greater than 1 unit or different from the fractional allotted to investor during the NFO, the same is liable to be rejected.

For example: If 3.752 units are allotted to an investor during the NFO, the investor can redeem only 0.752 units directly with the AMC. Thus, any redemption application made for greater than or less than 0.752 units shall be liable to be rejected. The remaining 3 whole units will be tradable on the exchange.

#### Exit opportunity for investors other than Market Makers and Large Investors



Investors, other than Market Makers, can sell units in less than Creation Unit Size of the Scheme directly to the Mutual Fund without any exit load in the following cases if:

- a. Traded price (closing price) of the ETF units is at a discount of more than 1% to the end day NAV for 7 continuous trading days; or
- b. No quotes for such ETFs are available on stock exchange(s) for 3 consecutive trading days; or
- c. Total bid size on the exchange(s) is less than half of the Creation Unit Size daily, averaged over a period of 7 consecutive trading days.

In case of the above scenarios, applications received from investors for redemption up to 3.00 p.m. on any trading day, shall be processed by the AMC at the closing NAV of the day.

In case of redemptions by NRIs, requisite TDS will be deducted from the respective redemption proceeds. The mutual fund will track the aforesaid liquidity criteria on a continuous basis and in case if any of the above mentioned scenario arises, the same shall be displayed on website www.mutualfund.adityabirlacapital.com.

### A. COMPUTATION OF NAV

The Net Asset Value (NAV) per Unit of the scheme will be computed by dividing the net assets of the scheme by the number of Units outstanding under the scheme on the valuation date. The Mutual Fund will value its investments according to the valuation norms, as specified in Schedule VIII of the SEBI Regulations, or such norms as may be specified by SEBI from time to time.

The NAV of units of the Scheme shall be calculated up to four decimal points as shown below:

### VALUATION OF GOLD

Since physical gold are denominated in gold tonnage, it will be valued based on the market price of gold in the domestic market and will be marked to market on a daily basis. The market price of gold in the domestic market on any Business Day would be arrived at as under:

- (1) the gold held by the scheme shall be valued at the AM fixing price as per regulatory norms in US dollars per troy ounce for gold having a fineness of 995.0 parts per thousand, subject to the following:
  - (a) adjustment for conversion to metric measure as per standard conversion rates;
  - (b) adjustment for conversion of US dollars into Indian rupees as per the RBI reference rate; and
  - (c) Addition of-
  - (i) transportation and other charges that may be normally incurred in bringing such gold from London to the place where it is actually stored on behalf of the mutual fund; and
  - (ii) notional customs duty and other applicable taxes and levies that may be normally incurred to bring the gold from the London to the place where it is actually stored on behalf of the mutual fund;

Provided that the adjustment under clause (c) above may be made on the basis of a notional premium that is usually charged for delivery of gold to the place where it is stored on behalf of the mutual fund;

Provided further that where the gold held by a scheme has a greater fineness, the relevant prices as per regulatory norms AM fixing shall be taken as the reference price under this sub-paragraph.

(2) If the gold acquired by the Scheme is not in the form of standard bars, it shall be assayed and converted into standard bars which comply with the good delivery as per regulatory norms and thereafter valued in terms of subparagraph (1).

The market price of gold in the domestic market on any business day would be arrived at as under:



Domestic price of physical gold = (London Bullion Market Association AM fixing in US\$/ounce X Conversion factor for converting ounce into kg for 0.995 fineness X rate for US\$ into INR) + Custom duty for import of gold + Sales Tax/octroi and other levies applicable.

The Trustees reserve the right to change the source for determining the exchange rate. The AMC shall record in writing the reason for change in the source for determining the exchange rate.

### Illustration of computation of NAV:

If the net assets of the Scheme are Rs.10,55,34,567.12 and units outstanding are 100,00,000, then the NAV per unit will be computed as follows:

10,55,34,567.12 / 100,00,000 = Rs. 10.5534 p.u. (rounded off to four decimals)

For other details such as policies w.r.t computation of NAV, rounding off, investment in foreign securities, procedure in case of delay in disclosure of NAV etc. refer to SAI.

### B. NEW FUND OFFER (NFO) EXPENSES

These expenses are incurred for the purpose of various activities related to the NFO like sales and distribution fees paid marketing and advertising, registrar expenses, printing and stationery, bank charges etc. All the NFO expenses of the Scheme shall be borne by the AMC.

The entire amount subscribed by the investor subject to deduction of transaction charges, if any, in the scheme during the New Fund Offer will be available to the scheme for investments.

### C. ANNUAL SCHEME RECURRING EXPENSES

These are the fees and expenses for operating the scheme. These expenses include Investment Management and Advisory Fee charged by the AMC, Registrar and Transfer Agents' fee, marketing and selling costs etc. as given in the table related to maximum permissible expense below:

Within the limits specified under the SEBI Regulations, the AMC has estimated that the following will be charged to the scheme as expenses. For the actual current expenses being charged, the investor should refer to the website of the mutual fund. Further, any change in the expense ratio will be updated on our website and the same will be communicated to investor via SMS / e-mail 3 working days prior to the effective date of change.

# As per Regulation 52(6)(b) of SEBI (MF) Regulations, the total expense ratio of the scheme including the investment and advisory fees shall not exceed 1.00 per cent of the daily net assets.

In addition to total expense permissible within limits of Regulation 52 (6)(b) of SEBI (MF) Regulations as above, the AMC may charge the following to the scheme in terms of Regulation 52(6A) of SEBI (MF) Regulations:

(a) Additional expenses not exceeding of 0.30% of daily net assets may be charged to the Scheme, if the new inflows from retail investors^ from beyond top 30 cities\* are at least (i) 30% of gross new inflows in the scheme or (ii) 15% of the average assets under management (year to date) of the scheme, whichever is higher.
 ^As per para 10.1 of SEBI Master Circular on Mutual Funds, inflows of amount upto Rs 2.00.000/- per

\*As per para 10.1 of SEBI Master Circular on Mutual Funds, inflows of amount upto Rs 2,00,000/- per transaction, by individual investors shall be considered as inflows from "retail investor".

\*Beyond Top 30 (B30) cities shall mean beyond top 30 cities based on Association of Mutual Funds in India (AMFI) data on 'AUM by Geography - Consolidated Data for Mutual Fund Industry' as at the end of the previous financial year.

In case inflows from beyond such cities is less than the higher of (i) or (ii) mentioned above, such additional expense on daily net assets of the scheme shall be charged on proportionate basis in accordance with para 10.1.3 of SEBI Master Circular on Mutual Funds.

Inflows from corporates and institutions from B-30 cities will not be considered for computing the inflows from B-30 cities for the purpose of additional TER of 30 basis points.

The expense so charged shall be utilized for distribution expenses incurred for bringing inflows from such cities. However, the amount incurred as expense on account of inflows from such cities shall be credited back to the scheme in case the said inflows are redeemed within a period of one year from the date of investment.



Note: SEBI vide its letter no. SEBI/HO/IMD-SEC-3/P/OW/2023/5823/1 dated February 24,2023 and AMFI letter dated No. 35P/ MEM-COR/ 85-a/ 2022-23 dated March 02, 2023 has directed AMCs to keep B-30 incentive structure in abeyance with effect from March 01, 2023 till further notice.

- (b) Brokerage and transaction cost incurred for the purpose of execution of trade shall be charged to the schemes as provided under Regulation 52 (6A) (a) upto 12 bps for cash market transactions and 0.05 per cent of the value of trades in case of derivatives transactions. In terms of para 10.1.14 of SEBI Master Circular on Mutual Funds, any payment towards brokerage and transaction costs (including GST, if any) incurred for the execution of trades, over and above the said 0.12 per cent for cash market transactions and 0.05 per cent of the value of derivatives transactions may be charged to the scheme within the maximum limit of Total Expense Ratio (TER) as prescribed under Regulation 52 of the SEBI (MF) Regulations.
- (c) Additional expenses incurred towards different heads mentioned under Regulations 52(2) and 52(4) of SEBI (MF) Regulations, not exceeding 0.05 per cent of daily net assets of the scheme.

The AMC has estimated the following recurring expenses, as detailed in table related to maximum permissible expense below. The expenses are estimated have been made in good faith as per the information available to the AMC based on past experience and are subject to change inter se.

#### Note:

- (a) The TER of the Direct Plan will be lower to the extent of the abovementioned distribution expenses/ commission which is charged in the Regular Plan.
- (b) In terms of para 10.1.16 of SEBI Master Circular on Mutual Funds read with SEBI Circular dated December 31, 2024., the AMC / Mutual Fund shall annually set apart 5% of total TER charged to direct plans, subject to



maximum of 0.5 bps on AUM of the Scheme within the maximum limit of Total Expense Ratio as per Regulation 52 of the SEBI (MF) Regulations for investor education and awareness initiatives. In terms of para 10.3 of SEBI Master Circular on Mutual Funds, AMC may charge the following Fees and expenses as mentioned below:

- a. Investment Management and Advisory Fees: AMC may charge GST on investment management and advisory fees to the Scheme in addition to the maximum limit of Total Expense Ratio as prescribed under Regulation 52 of the SEBI (MF) Regulations.

Also, the types of expenses charged shall be as per the SEBI (MF) Regulations.

Investors should note that, all scheme related expenses including commission paid to distributors will necessarily be paid from the Scheme only within the regulatory limits and not from the books of the ABSLAMC, its associate, sponsor, trustee or any other entity through any route.

The total recurring expenses of the Scheme excluding issue or redemption expenses, whether initially borne by the Mutual Fund or by the AMC, but including the investment management and advisory fee, shall not exceed the limits as prescribed under Regulation 52 of the SEBI (MF) Regulations.

	The units of the scheme shall be compulsorily traded in dematerialized form, and hence, there shall be no exit load for the units purchased or sold through stock exchanges.

At the time of changing the Load Structure following measures would be undertaken to avoid complaints from investors about investment in the schemes without knowing the loads:

- I. The addendum detailing the changes would be attached to Scheme Information Document and Key Information Document. The addendum will be circulated to all the distributors / brokers so that the same can be attached to all Scheme Information Documents and Key Information Documents already in stock.
- II. Arrangements will be made to display the addendum in the Scheme Information Document in the form of a notice in all the Investor Service Centres and distributors / brokers office.
- III. The introduction of the Exit Load alongwith the details would be stamped in the acknowledgement slip issued to the investors on submission of the application form and would also be disclosed in the statement of accounts issued after the introduction of such load.
- IV. Any other measure which the AMC/Mutual Fund may feel necessary.

#### E. REQUIREMENT OF MINIMUM INVESTORS IN THE SCHEME

As per provision 6.11.4.2 of para 6.4 of SEBI Master Circular on Mutual Funds, the provisions with respect to minimum number of investors and maximum holding for single investor are not applicable to an exchange traded fund and accordingly, these provisions shall not be applicable to Aditya Birla Sun Life Gold ETF.



### Section II

### I. INTRODUCTION

### A. DEFINITIONS/INTERPRETATION

In this Scheme Information Document, the words and expressions shall have the meaning specified in the following link, unless the context otherwise requires.

#### Interpretation

For all purposes of this Scheme Information Document, except as otherwise expressly provided or unless the context otherwise requires, the terms defined in this Scheme Information Document include the plural as well as the singular. Pronouns having a masculine or feminine gender shall be deemed to include the other. Words and expressions used herein but not defined herein shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them therein under the SEBI Act or the SEBI (MF) Regulations.

All references to "Master Circular" refer to Master Circular for Mutual Funds issued by SEBI dated June 27, 2024 as amended from time to time.

#### **B. RISK FACTORS**

For Standard Risk Factors, kindly refer Statement of Additional Information (SAI)

#### SCHEME SPECIFIC RISK FACTORS

Some of the scheme specific risk factors are included as below but are not limited to the following:

Liquidity Risk: Trading in units of the scheme on the Exchange may be halted because of market conditions or for reasons that in view of the Exchange authorities or SEBI, trading in units of the scheme is not advisable. In addition, trading in units is subject to trading halts caused by extraordinary market volatility and pursuant to Stock Exchange(s) and SEBI "circuit filter" rules as applicable from time to time. There can be no assurance that the requirements of the exchange/s necessary to maintain the listing of units of the scheme will continue to be met or will remain unchanged.

The Mutual Fund scheme has to sell gold only to bullion bankers/ traders who are authorized to buy gold. Though, there are adequate number of players (commercial or bullion bankers) to whom the Fund can sell gold. However, the Fund may have to resort to distress sale of gold if there is no or low demand for gold to meet its cash needs of redemption or expenses.

- **Regulatory Risk:** Any changes in trading regulations by the stock exchange (s) or SEBI may affect the ability of Market Maker/ Market maker to arbitrage resulting into wider premium/ discount to NAV. Any changes in any other regulation relating to import and export of gold or gold jewellery (including customs duty, sales tax and any such other statutory levies) may affect the ability of the scheme to buy/sell gold against the purchase and redemption requests received.
- **Passive Management of Investments:** Scheme shall follow a passive investment strategy. The scheme's performance may be affected by the general price decline in the gold prices. The scheme shall invest in Gold regardless of their investment merit. The scheme does not aim to take any defensive position in case of falling markets.
- Active Market: Although the scheme is proposed to be listed on exchanges, there can be no assurance that an active secondary market will be developed or maintained. The AMC and the Trustees will not be liable for delay in trading of Units on Stock Exchange due to the occurrence of any event beyond their control. For an investor in less than creation unit size, exchange quotes may not be always available.
- Tracking Error and Tracking Difference: Tracking error may have an impact on the performance of the scheme. However, the AMC will endeavour to keep the tracking error as low as possible. Tracking error may be accounted by the various reasons which includes but not limited to expenses, cash balance to meet redemptions, payout of IDCW, delay in purchase/sell of gold, Illiquidity, delay in realization of sale proceeds, buy/sell



transactions at different point in time which may not correspond to the closing price, transaction cost (including taxes, insurance etc), creation of lot size etc.

"Tracking Error" i.e. the annualised standard deviation of the difference in daily returns between physical gold and the NAV of gold ETF based on past one year rolling over data (For ETFs in existence for a period of less than one year, annualized standard deviation shall be calculated based on available data) shall not exceed 2%. The disclosure regarding the same shall be made on monthly basis on the website of the AMC. Tracking Error may arise including but not limited to the following reasons: -

a) Any delay experienced in the purchase or sale of Gold due to:

- Illiquidity of gold,
- Delay in realization of sale proceeds,
- Creating a lot size to buy the required amount of gold.
- b) The charging of expenses to the scheme including investment management fees, custodian fees, taxes, levies, etc.
- c) The potential for trades to fail, which may result in the Scheme not having acquired gold at a price necessary to track the index.
- d) The holding of a cash position prior to distribution and accrued expenses.
- e) Execution of large buy/sell orders
- f) The Scheme may buy or sell gold at different points of time during the trading session at the then prevailing prices which may not correspond to its closing prices.
- g) Disinvestments to meet redemptions, recurring expenses, etc.

It will be the endeavor of the fund manager to keep the tracking error as low as possible.

In case of unavoidable circumstances in the nature of force majeure which are beyond the control of the AMCs, the tracking error may exceed 2%, for which approval of Board of AMC and Trustees shall be taken and the same shall prominently be disclosed on the website of the AMC.

Along with the disclosure of tracking error, gold ETF schemes shall also disclose the tracking difference i.e. the difference of returns between physical gold and the gold ETF, on the website of the AMC on monthly basis for tenures 1 year, 3 year, 5 year, 10 year and since the date of allotment of units. Tracking Difference shall not exceed 50 bps (over and above the actual TER charged.) In case the same is not maintained, it shall be brought to the notice of trustees along with corrective actions taken by the AMC, if any.

- Redemption Risk: Investors may note that even though this is an open ended scheme, the Scheme would repurchase units in creation unit size only. Thus, if the unit holding is less than the creation unit size then it can be sold only through the secondary market on the exchange where the units are listed, subject to rules and regulations of the Stock Exchange. The AMC will appoint Market Maker(s) to provide liquidity in secondary market on an ongoing basis. The Market Maker(s) would offer daily two-way quote in the market. Further the price received upon redemption of units may be less than the value of the gold represented by them.
- The market price of the ETF unit like any other listed security is largely dependent on two factors viz. the intrinsic value of the unit (or NAV) and demand and supply of the units in the market. Sizeable demand or supply of the units in exchange may lead to market price of the units to quote at premium or discount to NAV. And hence the units of the scheme may trade above or below the NAV. However given that the investors can transact with AMC directly beyond the creation unit size of the scheme there should not be a significant variation (large premium or discount) and it may not sustain due to the arbitrage opportunity available.
- The gold price reflects the prices of gold at a point in time, which is the price at close of business day. The scheme, however, may trade these securities at different points in time during the trading session and therefore the prices at which the scheme trades may not be identical to the closing price of gold.
- **Market Risk:** The value of the Units relates directly to the value of the gold held by the Scheme and fluctuations in the price of gold could adversely affect investment value of the Units. The factors that may affect the price of gold, inter alia, include demand & supply, economic and political developments, changes in interest rates and perceived trends in bullion prices, exchange rates, inflation trends, market movements, movement/trade of gold that may be imposed by RBI, trade and restrictions on import/export of gold or gold jewellery etc. Hence the investor may also lose money due to fluctuation in the prices of the Gold.
- **Performance/Asset Class Risk:** The performance of the gold will have a direct bearing on the performance of the scheme. The returns from physical gold may underperform returns from any other asset class.



- **Currency Risk:** The formula for deriving the NAV of the units of the scheme is based on the imported (landed) value of the gold, which is computed by multiplying international market price by US Dollar value. Hence the value of NAV or Gold will depend upon the conversion value and attracts all the risk associated with such conversion.
- **Physical Gold:** There is a risk that part or all of the Scheme's gold could be lost, damaged or stolen. Access to the Scheme's gold could also be restricted by natural events or human actions. Any of these actions may have adverse impact on the operations of the scheme and consequently on investment in units.
- **Counter party Risk:** There is no Exchange for physical gold in India. The Mutual Fund may have to buy or sell gold from the open market, which may lead to counter party risks for the Mutual Fund for trading and settlement.
- **Operational Risks:** Gold Exchange Traded Funds are relatively new products and their value could decrease if unanticipated operational or trading problems arise. Gold Exchange Traded Fund, an open ended Exchange Traded Fund, is therefore subject to operational risks. In addition, investors should be aware that there is no assurance that gold will maintain its long-term value in terms of purchasing power. In the event that the price of gold declines, the value of investment in Units is expected to decline proportionately
- The scheme may not be able to acquire or sell the desired number of units of gold due to conditions prevailing in the market, such as, but not restricted to circuit filters on the gold ETF (if any), liquidity and volatility in gold prices
- The units of the scheme will be compulsorily issued in dematerialised form through depositories. The records of the depository are final with respect to the number of Units available to the credit of Unit holder. Settlement of trades, repurchase of Units by the Mutual Fund will depend upon the confirmations to be received from depository (ies) on which the Mutual Fund has no control. Further, Investors may note that buying and selling units on stock exchange requires the investor to engage the services of a broker and are subject to payment of margins as required by the stock exchange/ broker, payment of brokerage, securities transactions tax and such other costs.
- The NAV of the units of Gold ETF are determined based on the formula as prescribed by the SEBI, whereas the actual price in the market may be different from the value of gold at based on the prescribed formula. This may lead to a condition where the NAV is too different from the domestic market price of gold. In such cases the trustees reserves the right to delay or suspend the buy/sell transactions.
- A day on which valuation as per regulatory norms is not available shall not be a Business day and hence NAV for the said day shall not be available to the Investors.
- The Trustee, in general interest of the Unit holders of the Scheme offered under this Scheme Information Document and keeping in view of the unforeseen circumstances/ unusual market conditions, may limit the total number of Units, which can be redeemed on any Business Day.
- Governments, central banks and related institutions, own a significant portion of the aggregate world gold holdings. If one or more of these institutions decides to sell in amounts large enough to cause a decline in world gold prices, the price of Units of the Scheme will be adversely affected.
- Conversion of underlying physical gold into the Units of the Scheme may attract capital gain tax depending on acquisition cost and holding period.
- Liquidity risks in physical or derivative markets impairing the ability of the fund to buy and sell gold Commodities tend to be more volatile than other instruments. This may have an impact on liquidity. Liquidity considerations may have a price basis risk. Liquidity risks may arise due to issues related to the supply chain which affects the availability of gold. The lack of liquidity in the physical market may also arise due to seasonality of demand and supply or volatility of prices. Lastly, government regulations including change in taxation or duties levied on gold may affect the demand and supply and may affect the liquidity.

#### • Risks associated with handling, storing and safekeeping of physical gold:

There is a risk that part or all of the Scheme's gold could be lost, damaged or stolen. Access to the Scheme's gold could also be restricted by natural events or human actions. Any of these actions may have adverse impact on the operations of the scheme and consequently on investment in units.

### • RISK FACTORS ASSOCIATED WITH INVESTMENTS IN FIXED INCOME SECURITIES:

 Price-Risk or Interest-Rate Risk: Fixed income securities such as bonds, debentures and money market instruments run price-risk or interest-rate risk. Generally, when interest rates rise, prices of existing fixed income securities fall and when interest rates drop, such prices increase. The extent of fall or rise in the prices is a function of the existing coupon, days to maturity and the increase or decrease in the level of interest rates.



However, debt securities in this scheme are intended to be held till maturity. For such securities held till maturity, there will not be any interest rate risk at the end of the tenure.

- **Credit Risk:** In simple terms this risk means that the issuer of a debenture/ bond or a money market instrument may default on interest payment or even in paying back the principal amount on maturity. Even where no default occurs, the price of a security may go down because the credit rating of an issuer goes down. It must, however, be noted that where the Scheme has invested in Government securities, there is no credit risk to that extent.
- **Liquidity or Marketability Risk:** This refers to the ease with which a security can be sold at or near to its valuation Yield-To-Maturity (YTM). The primary measure of liquidity risk is the spread between the bid price and the offer price quoted by a dealer. Liquidity risk is today characteristic of the Indian fixed income market.
- **Reinvestment Risk:** Investments in fixed income securities may carry reinvestment risk as interest rates prevailing on the interest or maturity due dates may differ from the original coupon of the bond. Consequently, the proceeds may get invested at a lower rate.
- Different types of securities in which the scheme would invest as given in the Scheme Information Document carry different levels and types of risk. Accordingly, the scheme's risk may increase or decrease depending upon its investment pattern. e.g. corporate bonds carry a higher amount of risk than Government securities. Further even among corporate bonds, bonds, which are AA rated, are comparatively more risky than bonds, which are AAA rated.
- The above are some of the common risks associated with investments in fixed and money market securities. There can be no assurance that a Scheme's investment objectives will be achieved, or that there will be no loss of capital. Investment results may vary substantially on a monthly, quarterly or annual basis.

### C. RISK MITIGATION STRATEGIES

### TRACKING ERROR RISK

While the objective of the Scheme is to closely track the price of Physical Gold, the performance may not be commensurate with the Price of Gold on any given day or over any given period. Such variations are commonly referred to as the tracking error.

Tracking errors may cause the scheme to generate returns which are not in line with the performance of the underlying benchmark and may arise from a variety of factors including but not limited to:

- Any delay experienced in the purchase or sale of Gold due to:
  - o Illiquidity of Gold,
  - o Delay in realization of sale proceeds,
  - Creating a lot size to buy the required amount of gold.
- The charging of expenses to the scheme including investment management fees, custodian fees, taxes, levies, etc.
- The potential for trades to fail, which may result in the Scheme not having acquired gold at a price necessary to track the benchmark.
- The holding of a cash position prior to distribution and accrued expenses.
- Execution of large buy/sell orders
- The Scheme may buy or sell gold at different points of time during the trading session at the then prevailing prices which may not correspond to its closing prices.
- Disinvestments to meet redemptions, recurring expenses etc.

AMC would monitor the tracking error of the Scheme on an ongoing basis and would seek to minimize tracking error to the maximum extent possible. Under normal circumstances, such tracking errors are not expected to exceed 2% per annum. However, this may vary due to the reasons mentioned above or any other reasons that may arise and particularly when the markets are very volatile. In case of unavoidable circumstances in the nature of force majeure which are beyond the control of the AMCs, the tracking error may exceed 2%, for which approval of Board of AMC and Trustees shall be taken and the same shall prominently be disclosed on the website of the AMC.

**Tracking Difference:** The tracking difference i.e. the annualized difference of daily returns between the index and the NAV of the Scheme will be disclosed on the website of the AMC and AMFI, on a monthly basis, for tenures 1 year, 3 year, 5 year, 10 year and since the date of allotment of units. However, there can be no assurance or guarantee that the Scheme will achieve any particular level of tracking error relative to performance of the Underlying benchmark.



### D. INFORMATION ABOUT THE SCHEME:

### E. WHERE WILL THE SCHEME INVEST?

Subject to the Regulations, the corpus of the Scheme can be invested in any (but not exclusively) of the following securities:

1. The significant portion of corpus of the Scheme will be invested in physical gold of 99.5% finesses i.e. 995 parts per 1000 parts or higher.

### 2. Debt and Money Markets Instruments

- Certificate of Deposits (CD) CD is a negotiable money market instrument issued by scheduled commercial banks and select all-India Financial Institutions that have been permitted by the RBI to raise short term resources. The maturity period of CDs issued by the Banks is between 7 days to one year, whereas, in case of FIs, maturity is between one year to 3 years from the date of issue. CDs may be issued at a discount to face value.
- Commercial Paper (CP) -CP is an unsecured negotiable money market instrument issued in the form of a promissory note, generally issued by the corporates, primary dealers and all India Financial Institutions as an alternative source of short term borrowings. They are issued at a discount to the face value as may be determined by the issuer. CP is traded in secondary market and can be freely bought and sold before maturity.
- 3. Securities issued by the Central and State Governments as may be permitted by RBI, securities guaranteed by the Central and State Governments (including but not limited to coupon bearing bonds, zero coupon bonds and treasury bills). Central Government securities are sovereign debt obligations of the Government of India with zero-risk of default and issued on its behalf by RBI. They form part of Government's annual borrowing programme and are used to fund the fiscal deficit along with other short term and long term requirements. Such securities could be fixed rate, fixed interest rate with put/call option, zero coupon bond, floating ratebonds, capital indexed bonds, fixed interest security with staggered maturity payment etc. State Government securities are issued by the respective State Government in co-ordination with the RBI.
- 4. Debt obligations of domestic Government agencies and statutory bodies, which may or may not carry a Central/State Government guarantee –These are instruments which are issued by various government agencies and bodies. They can be issued at discount, par or premium.
- 5. Corporate debt and securities (of both public and private sector undertakings) including Bonds, Debentures, Notes, Strips etc. These are instruments issued by corporate entities for their business requirements. They are generally rated by credit rating agencies, higher the rating lower the risk of default.
- 6. The non-convertible part of convertible securities Convertible securities are securities which can be converted from Debt to Equity shares. The non-convertible part cannot be converted into Equity shares and work like a normal debt instrument.
- 7. **Investment in money market instrument** The Scheme may also invest in money market instruments, in compliance with Regulations. Money Market Instruments include commercial papers, commercial bills, treasury bills, Government securities having an unexpired maturity upto one year, call or notice money, certificate of deposit, usance bill and any other like instruments as specified by the Reserve Bank/SEBI of India from time to time subject to regulatory approvals, if any.
- 8. Any other domestic fixed income securities.

The securities mentioned above could be listed or to be listed, secured or unsecured, and of varying maturity, as enabled under SEBI (MF) Regulations/circulars/ RBI. The securities may be acquired through Initial Public Offerings (IPOs), secondary market operations, private placement, rights offers or negotiated deals.

### F. WHAT ARE THE INVESTMENT RESTRICTIONS?

All investments by the Scheme and the Mutual Fund will be within the investment restrictions as specified in the SEBI (MF) Regulations. Pursuant to the SEBI (MF) Regulations, the following investment and other restrictions are presently applicable to the scheme:

- All investments by the Scheme shall be made only in listed or to be listed equity shares and equity related instruments.
- The corpus of the scheme shall be invested only in Physical gold



- Pending deployment of the corpus of the Scheme in securities in terms of investment objective, the Fund can invest the corpus of the Scheme in short term deposits of scheduled commercial banks in accordance with the guidelines issued by SEBI. Accordingly, as presently prescribed, the requirements of para 12.16 of SEBI Master Circular on Mutual Funds and such other guidelines as may be specified by SEBI from time to time:
- i. "Short Term" for parking of funds shall be treated as a period not exceeding 91 days. Such short-term deposits shall be held in the name of the Scheme.
- ii. The Scheme shall not park more than 15% of the net assets in short term deposit(s) of all the scheduled commercial banks put together. However, such limit may be raised to 20% with the approval of the Trustee.
- iii. Parking of funds in short term deposits of associate and sponsor scheduled commercial banks together shall not exceed 20% of total deployment by the Mutual Fund in short term deposits.
- iv. The Scheme shall not park more than 10% of the net assets in short term deposit(s), with any one scheduled commercial bank including its subsidiaries.
- v. The Scheme shall not park funds in short-term deposit of a bank which has invested in the Scheme. The bank in which a scheme has short-term deposit shall not invest in the scheme until the scheme has short-term deposit with such bank.

The AMC will not charge any investment management and advisory fees for funds under the Scheme parked in short term deposits of scheduled commercial banks.

The above norms do not apply to term deposits placed as margins for trading in cash and derivatives market. However, all term deposits placed as margins shall be disclosed in the half yearly portfolio statements under a separate heading. Details such as name of bank, amount of term deposits, duration of term deposits, percentage of NAV should be disclosed.

- In accordance with para 12.8.3 of SEBI Master Circular on Mutual funds as amended from time to time, the scheme shall not invest more than:
  - a. 10% of its NAV in debt and money market securities rated AAA; or
  - b. 8% of its NAV in debt and money market securities rated AA; or
  - c. 6% of its NAV in debt and money market securities rated A and below issued by a single issuer.

The above investment limits may be extended by up to 2% of the NAV of the scheme with prior approval of the Board of Trustees and Board of Directors of the AMC, subject to compliance with the overall 12% limit specified in clause 1 of Seventh Schedule of MF Regulation.

The long term rating of issuers shall be considered for the money market instruments. However, if there is no long term rating available for the same issuer, then based on credit rating mapping of CRAs between short term and long term ratings, the most conservative long term rating shall be taken for a given short term rating. Exposure to government money market instruments such as TREPS on G-Sec/ T-bills shall be treated as exposure to government securities.

Provided that, such limit shall not be applicable for investments in government securities, treasury bills, triparty repo on Government securities or treasury bills. Provided further that investment within such limit can be made in mortgaged backed securitised debt which are rated not below investment grade by a credit rating agency registered with SEBI.

The scheme existing as on the date of aforesaid circular shall be grandfathered from these guidelines till the maturity of the underlying debt and money market securities.

Considering the nature of the Scheme, investments in such instruments will be permitted upto 5% of its NAV.

- Investment in unrated debt and money market instruments (other than government securities, treasury bills, derivative products such as Interest Rate Swaps (IRS), Interest Rate Futures (IRF), etc.) by the Scheme shall not exceed 5% of the net assets of the Scheme. However, all such investments shall be made with the prior approval of the Board of AMC and Trustees.
- The Scheme shall not invest in unlisted debt instruments including commercial papers (CPs), other than (a) government securities, (b) other money market instruments and (c) derivative products such as Interest Rate Swaps (IRS), Interest Rate Futures (IRF), etc. which are used by mutual funds for hedging. However, mutual fund schemes may invest in unlisted Non-Convertible Debentures (NCDs) not exceeding 10% of the debt portfolio of the scheme subject to the condition that such unlisted NCDs have a simple structure (i.e. with fixed and uniform coupon, fixed maturity period, without any options, fully paid up upfront, without any credit enhancements or structured obligations) and are rated and secured with coupon payment frequency on monthly basis.



Provided further that, the Scheme shall comply with the norms under this clause within the time and in the manner as may be specified by the Board.

- All investments by the Scheme in CPs would be made only in CPs which are listed or to be listed.
- The Mutual Fund under all its schemes shall not own more than 10% of any company's paid up capital carrying voting rights.

Provided, for investments in asset management company or trustee company of other mutual fund, collective investment of sponsor of a mutual fund, its associate and/or its group company, and its AMC through Schemes should be considered for calculating 10% voting rights.

- The investment of the Scheme in the following instruments shall not exceed 10% of the debt portfolio of the Scheme and the group exposure in such instruments shall not exceed 5% of the debt portfolio of the Scheme:
  - i. Unsupported rating of debt instruments (i.e. without factoring-in credit enhancements) is below investment grade; and

ii. Supported rating of debt instruments (i.e. after factoring-in credit enhancement) is above investment grade The above limits shall not be applicable on investments in securitized debt instruments.

- Investment by the Scheme in debt instruments, having credit enhancements backed by equity shares directly or
  indirectly, shall have a minimum cover of 4 times considering the market value of such shares. Further, the
  investment in debt instruments having credit enhancements should be sufficiently covered to address the market
  volatility and reduce the inefficiencies of invoking of the pledge or cover, whenever required, without impacting
  the interest of the investors. In case of fall in the value of the cover below the specified limit, AMCs will initiate
  necessary steps to ensure protection of the interest of the investors.
- Transfer of investments from one scheme to another scheme in the Mutual Fund is permitted provided:
  - Such transfers are done at the prevailing market price for quoted instruments on spot basis (spot basis shall have the same meaning as specified by a Stock Exchange for spot transactions); and
  - The securities so transferred shall be in conformity with the investment objective of the Scheme to which such transfer has been made.
- Transfer of investments from one scheme to another scheme in the Mutual Fund is permitted provided the same are line with para 12.30 of SEBI Master Circular on Mutual Funds .
- The Mutual fund may buy and sell physical gold/securities on the basis of deliveries and shall in all cases of purchases take delivery of gold/securities and in all cases of sale, deliver the gold/securities. Further the Mutual Fund shall enter into derivative transactions on a recognised stock exchange for the purpose of trading, hedging and portfolio balancing in accordance with the guidelines issued by SEBI
- The scheme shall not make any investment in:
  - Any unlisted security of an associate or group company of the Sponsor; or
  - Any security issued by way of private placement by an associate or group company of the Sponsor; or
  - The listed securities of group companies of the Sponsor, which is in excess of 25% of the net assets.
- The Mutual Fund shall not borrow except to meet temporary liquidity needs of the Fund for the purpose of repurchase / redemption of Units or payment of interest and IDCW to the Unitholders in accordance with the provisions of SEBI Regulations as applicable from time to time.
- Debentures, irrespective of any residual maturity period (above or below 1 year), shall attract the investment restrictions as applicable for debt instruments as specified under Clause 1 and 1A of the Seventh Schedule to the Regulations or as may be specified by SEBI from time to time.
- Save as otherwise expressly provided under SEBI (MF) Regulations, the Mutual Fund shall not advance any loans for any purpose.
- The Scheme may invest in another Scheme under the same AMC or any other mutual fund without charging any fees, provided that aggregate inter-Scheme investment made by all Schemes under the same AMC or in Schemes under the management of any other asset management shall not exceed 5% of the net asset value of the Mutual Fund.
- The Scheme shall not invest in Foreign Securities.
- The Scheme shall not invest in a fund of funds scheme.
- The Scheme shall not invest in Securitised Debt.
- The Scheme shall not engage in short selling of securities.
- The Scheme will comply with any other regulations applicable to the investments of mutual funds from time to time.

The Trustees may alter the above restrictions from time to time to the extent that changes in the SEBI (MF) Regulations may allow and as deemed fit in the general interest of the unit holders.

All investment restrictions shall be applicable at the time of making investment.



These investment restrictions shall in the ordinary course apply as at the date of the most recent transaction or commitment to invest, and changes do not have to be effected merely because, owing to appreciations or depreciations in value, or by reason of the receipt of any rights, bonuses or benefits in the nature of capital or of any Scheme of arrangement or for amalgamation, reconstruction or exchange, or at any repayment or redemption or other reason outside the control of the Fund, any such limits would thereby be breached. If these limits are exceeded for reasons beyond its control, AMC shall as soon as possible take appropriate corrective action, taking into account the interests of the Unitholders.

In addition, certain investment parameters (like limits on exposure to Sectors, Industries, Companies, etc.) may be adopted internally by AMC, and amended from time to time, to ensure appropriate diversification / security for the Fund. The Trustee Company / AMC may alter these above stated limitations from time to time, and also to the extent the SEBI (Mutual Funds) Regulations, 1996 change, so as to permit the Scheme to make its investments in the full spectrum of permitted investments for Mutual Funds to achieve its investment objective.

As such investments by the Scheme will be made in accordance with SEBI (MF) Regulations, including Schedule VII thereof.

NAV of the scheme will be calculated up to four decimal places. AMC shall update the NAV on the AMFI website (www.amfiindia.ncom) and on the website of the Mutual Fund (www.mutualfund.adityabirlacapital.com) by 11.00 pm on the day of declaration of the NAV.



In case of any delay, the reasons for such delay would be explained to AMFI in writing. If the NAVs are not available before commencement of business hours on the following day due to any reason, Mutual Fund shall issue a press release providing reasons and explaining when the Mutual Fund would be able to publish the NAVs. NAV shall also be communicated to stock exchanges where the units of the scheme will be listed.

Further, the Mutual Fund / AMC will extend facility of sending latest available NAVs of the Scheme to the Unit holders through SMS upon receiving a specific request in this regard. Also, information regarding NAVs can be obtained by the Unit holders / Investors by calling or visiting the nearest ISC.

NAV shall also be communicated to stock exchanges where the units of the Scheme will be listed. ## C. Transaction charges and stamp duty-

No transaction charge shall be deducted from the subscription amount for transactions /applications received through the distributors.

Pursuant to Notification No. S.O. 1226(E) and G.S.R. 226(E) dated March 30, 2020 issued by the Department of Revenue, Ministry of Finance, Government of India, read with Part I of Chapter IV of Notification dated February 21, 2019 issued by Legislative Department, Ministry of Law and Justice, Government of India on the Finance Act, 2019, a stamp duty @ 0.005% of the transaction value would be levied on allotment of Mutual Fund units including units allotted in demat mode. Accordingly, pursuant to levy of stamp duty, the number of units allotted on subscriptions to the unitholders would be reduced to that extent.
